"Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is a whole-school framework that promotes positive behaviour across a school and helps schools develop safe and supportive learning environments.

Schools which implement the PBL framework make sure all students are explicitly taught the expected behaviours and establish clear and consistent boundaries. Staff take a proactive, preventative approach to ensure all students receive the appropriate level of support to help them to be successful at school.

Student outcomes are monitored so identified students can receive additional support when needed, and a minority of students can access intensive support to enable them to engage successfully at school." (Department of Education, Queensland Government, 2024)

At Wynnum State High School our PROUD values are: Positive, Respectful On-task, Unified and Determined. Here at Wynnum High, we know when we follow the PROUD mantra, school is a much more pleasant place to be and allows us to reach our full potential.

Positive rewards

- PROUD nominations for students consistently doing the right things, if a student receives three nominations or more in a term, they are invited to an end of term celebration which varies each term.
- PROUD postcard This is a postcard that is sent home to parents, when a student has demonstrated the PROUD behaviours.
- PROUD token this is for our senior students (Years 10-12) as this allows them to go in the draw to win either a semi formal ticket (Year 10), a senior jersey (Year 11) or half a formal ticket (Year 12).
