QCE AND ATAR



QCE and ATAR

The Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE) and the ATAR (Australian Tertiary Admission Rank) are different and have a different purpose.



QCE

Certifies learning, showing the individual has achieved a specific standard of education at senior schooling level and may be considered by employers and the general community.



ATAR

Tells us about a student's position (or ranking) compared to all other students in the state. The only intended purpose for the ATAR is to assist with selecting applicants for tertiary study. QCE eligibility (Queensland Certificate of Education)

- Literacy and numeracy tick (all Year 12 students have met this criteria)
- 20 credits achieved over a set amount of learning contribute to your QCE:
 - General, Essential and Applied subjects
 - VET certificate courses (or a minimum standard of completed competencies – Completion of Certificate II up to 4 QCE points; Completion of Certificate III up to 8 QCE points)
 - University subjects

Units 3 & 4

- General subjects: Result calculated out of 100 across Units 3 & 4
- QCAA determine the cut-off for a C in General subjects after results are awarded, the cut-off varies for different subjects.
- Students should already know what they have received in their IA1 (results have been confirmed by QCAA) and their provisional results for IA2 and some IA3 (these will be confirmed by QCAA on 12 September)
- Confirmed results can be accessed via the myQCE in the Student Portal

ATAR (Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank)

- Primary mechanism used nationally for tertiary admissions.
- Indicates a student's position relative to other students.
- 2000-point scale from 99.95 down to 0.00. However, ATARs less than 30.00 are reported as '30 or less'.
- Queensland ATAR is calculated by QTAC for entry into tertiary courses. It is the standard pathway for tertiary study in Queensland.

You MUST pass English/Essential English to be eligible for an ATAR

How is ATAR calculated?

Step 1: Results in Units 3 and 4 are added together by QCAA to give a mark out of 100.

Step 2: QCAA provides these overall raw subject results and any completed VET qualifications to QTAC

Step 3: QTAC undertakes the subject scaling process

Step 4: The best 5 scaled subject results (from eligible inputs) are added together for each student = Best 5 Subject Aggregate

Step 5: Students are placed in a descending order of merit based on their Best 5 Subject Aggregates

Step 6: Students are allocated into the 2000 ATAR bands



Inter-subject scaling (calculated by QTAC)



- In the ATAR calculation process, scaling is the most difficult part to understand. It is however, a necessary part of the process to ensure fairness.
- Raw subject results are adjusted for a given subject to allow results for that subject to be <u>fairly</u> compared with the results from any other subject when calculating ATARs.
- Scaling outcomes for individual subjects are not predetermined and are expected to be different from one year to the next based on the performance of the student cohort for each year. Although trends will form, school, students and parents are advised not to use historical scaling data to predict future outcomes.
- QTAC provides an information handout to explain this in depth, with examples of how it applies to students.

Who are QTAC?

- Queensland Tertiary Admissions Centre
- Apply through ATAC for over 1800 courses at 17 Queensland institutions
- Institutions determine their own rules for admission and QTAC implements them.
- Rules are applied consistently within institutions, but rules can from institution to institution.

Setting up your ATAR account

- Use the QCAA version of given names as the first name in the ATAR portal
- Check that your date of birth is correct
- LUI number is needed
- Students should set up a personal email address as once you have graduated your EQ email address is no longer current



ATAR Release

- ATARs are released online only.
- Students will be able to receive an ATAR release notification via email and print a results notice.
- Eligible students will be able to print their ATAR Certificate once ATARs have been released.
- QTAC have both an appeals and verification process. They can be found in the policies page on the QTAC website.



ADJUSTMENT SCHEMES



Selection Ranks and Adjustment Factors

- ATARs are calculated only on the students' actual QCE subject results, which have been scaled.
- Adjustment Factors (EAS, subject adjustments, etc) are applied after the ATAR is calculated.
- Applicants may also be assigned a separate Selection Rank for completed VET qualifications.
- QTAC continues to administer Adjustment Factor schemes which have been determined by individual institutions (who all have different requirements around this)



Educational Access Scheme (EAS)

- EAS helps if your studies have been negatively affected by circumstances beyond your control
- Help you compete more equitably for an offer
- You can apply to EAS as part of your QTAC application
- Must include all the appropriate application forms and documentary evidence

Eligibility and Merit



Eligibility requirements

- Age requirements
- Subject prerequisites
- Portfolios, auditions, or interviews
- Essays or personal statements
- Questionnaires or exams (medicine and dentistry may require UCAT)

Some of these requirements might need to be submitted by a deadline. While researching your courses, make a note of early closing dates:



How is merit determined?

Merit is determined by your QTAC Selection Rank.

Applicants are allocated ranks based on their assessable qualifications.

Selections ranks can come from:

- ATARs
- Completed AQF qualifications (Cert III and IV)
- Diplomas, Advanced Diplomas
- Tertiary study (minimum 2 subjects required)
- Music, dance, and drama qualifications
- Bridging and preparation courses

QTAC Course Guide

Prerequisites - You **must** have these subjects at the specified level of achievement to be eligible for entry into that course

Assumed knowledge - Lecturers will pitch the content of the coursework assuming you have the knowledge from the specified subject at a Year 12 level

Recommended study - This knowledge would assist you in completing the study





Preferences

- Before you submit your QTAC application, you will need to make a list of your 6 preferred courses.
- Preferencing is an important part of the application process as only one offer is received at a time, based on your highest eligible preference.
- You can change your preferences for free 3 times.
- You can change your preferences after the application is lodged, after your ATAR is released and/or even after an offer is made.



What are Pathway courses?

Other tertiary study

- Less competitive degrees
- Different campuses
- Regional institutions
- Bridging and tertiary preparation courses

Combined diplomas/degrees

- Apply for entry into a Diploma
- Guaranteed entry into the Bachelor course if the Diploma is successfully completed
- Get credit for study done within the Diploma, and graduate with two qualifications

Ordering your preferences – an example

A student named Justice Laws has a estimated ATAR of 90.

Remember this is an estimate, so create a safety range around this score eg. 85-92.

Justice is a good English student & has a strong interest in pursuing Law as a career.

- Ensure that you fulfil all prerequisites and course entry requirements for the courses that you wish to apply for.
- Any changes to your preferences should be completed in one submission in order to lower costs.
- Ask QTAC for help if you need it.

- If you place a preference for a later offer round (e.g. June offer round) QTAC will hibernate your application until this offer round. No other preferences will be reviewed and you will not be considered by QTAC for an offer in earlier rounds.
