For many years Wynnum SHS has had a proud tradition of excellence in its Instrumental Music Program.

Students enrolling in Year 7 are able to continue their Instrumental Music studies at Wynnum SHS and further develop skills and technique on their chosen instrument.

Students who participate in the Instrumental Music Program will receive a 35-minute group lesson with a qualified music teacher. They will also be expected to join one of the school's four ensembles: the Symphonic Band, Big Band, Concert Band or Stage Band. These ensembles have a weekly rehearsal either before or after school.

Students who perform in the school's ensembles participate in an extensive range of performance opportunities including school-based concerts, competitions, festivals, community performances together with workshops, master classes, guest conductors and much more.

Instrumental music students also have the opportunity to participate in band tour and band camp.

Wynnum State High School's Instrumental Music Program offers students excellence in music education in a fun, friendly and supportive environment.

If your student does not currently play one of our curriculum instruments and would like to participate in the Instrumental Music Program, we suggest they receive outside of school lessons for one year and join the program once they complete the entry level standard of approximately end of *Book One Tradition Of Excellence*, By Bruce Pearson.

All students participating in the Instrumental music program are required to pay a non-refundable resource levy of \$120 which covers the cost of purchasing and copying music, teaching resources, music folder, band shirt and the purchase of equipment.

Students who use a school instrument are also required to pay an annual maintenance fee of \$120. Percussion students will pay an annual maintenance fee of \$40. **Please note, prices are reviewed annually and are subject to change.**
